Wooing overseas is always a challenge for any professional and if you are an India, always strive to given your best as Indians have always been considered intelligent, hardworking, talented and spiritual. Indians have always excelled in a competitive vrorxing environment and working overseas was something many Indians desired but few achieved till the information teChnology boom opened several wh8e-Collar job opportunities for them in global mankets. However, securing employment abroad may be an achievement but retaining it, is quite a challenge as a professional and exacting standards of competence. Then, there is this challenge of worming in an alien environment coupled with numerous Dther variables like culture, people, work ethics, local regulations, etc., that one is expected tD Cope up with the be suCCessful on the job. Change, thus, beComes inevitable as one moves into a new won environment and the best way to tackle change is to be prepared for it, and adapt to it rapidly. Let us dwell on some key faCtors thBt COMId be useful vvhen adapting to a foreign environment.

EaCh country is a mix of cultural and **SDCIal** influenCes that make a unique. Religious belief, way of speaking and behaviour, customs and traditions would all come across as very different. Also, home sickness and loneliness, all aspects of life and livelihood appear Confusing, alien and dlfflCMlt to comprehend. PFivaCy is highly valued in most countries which tends to translate into loneliness for most expatriates. One should experience the new culture and try different form of entertainment and make friends among people coming from different cultural backgrounds. When you start work it is a good idea to be observant. Absorb as much as you can about systems in the organization and adjust accordingly.

Must you speak the language of the country you are in? Yes, you should be at least conversational. co-workers want to speak their own language and will not be entirely comfortable if they cannat understand you. Even within the same language English, pronunciation can be a problem.

Westerners are particular about time so always make sure that you stick to time for meetings, attending offices and even social gatherings. Superiors at work and seniors and addressed by their first name. "sir' and "Madam' are not much in vogue. Mix with a side variety of people. Respect other' cultural background and keep clear of racist or sexist remarks and beliefs, Adapt to the local culture and trad6ions and be aware of the local favourites they are good social conversation breakers.
